Recycling and Deinking

The Brompton deinking plant



The Brompton facility uses a flotation-washing-dispersion process for deinking paper and magazines that have been collected and separated. The resulting product is then used in the composition of newsprint.

Recyclable material comes from our two sorting and recovery centers. One of the facilities, adjoining the Place Turcot mill, also supplies the mill with recycled paper and board. The other, Kruger Recycling, Inc., is located in Albany, New York.

The Brompton facility supplies both of Kruger's Brompton and Trois-Rivières mills with recycled pulp.

The Place Turcot Mill (Montréal)



Kruger has been recycling paper and board at its Place Turcot mill since 1960. The result is 100% recycled board used mainly to manufacture corrugated containers.

Turcal, the sorting and recovery center adjacent to the Place Turcot mill receives paper and board from curbside collection and, since 2007, also ensures the destruction of confidential documents for its customers. Kruger has long established ties with the municipalities, schools and institutions where it operates. These contacts supply us with the material we need, and enable us to contribute to the integration

of recycling into the lives of consumers.

Turcal's team of experienced representatives ensures the promotion of recovery programs in office buildings and institutions in Montreal and throughout the province. Representatives are in charge of distributing residential and industrial recycling bins.

Our mission also benefits the economy by creating jobs, which are all the more rewarding, since they relate to environmental protection.

Recycling: Corner Brook



Corner Brook Pulp and Paper Limited, a Kruger affiliate located in Newfoundland, is now able to supply its customers with newsprint containing recycled fiber. The process, implemented July 1, 1992, produces up to 188 tonnes per day.
