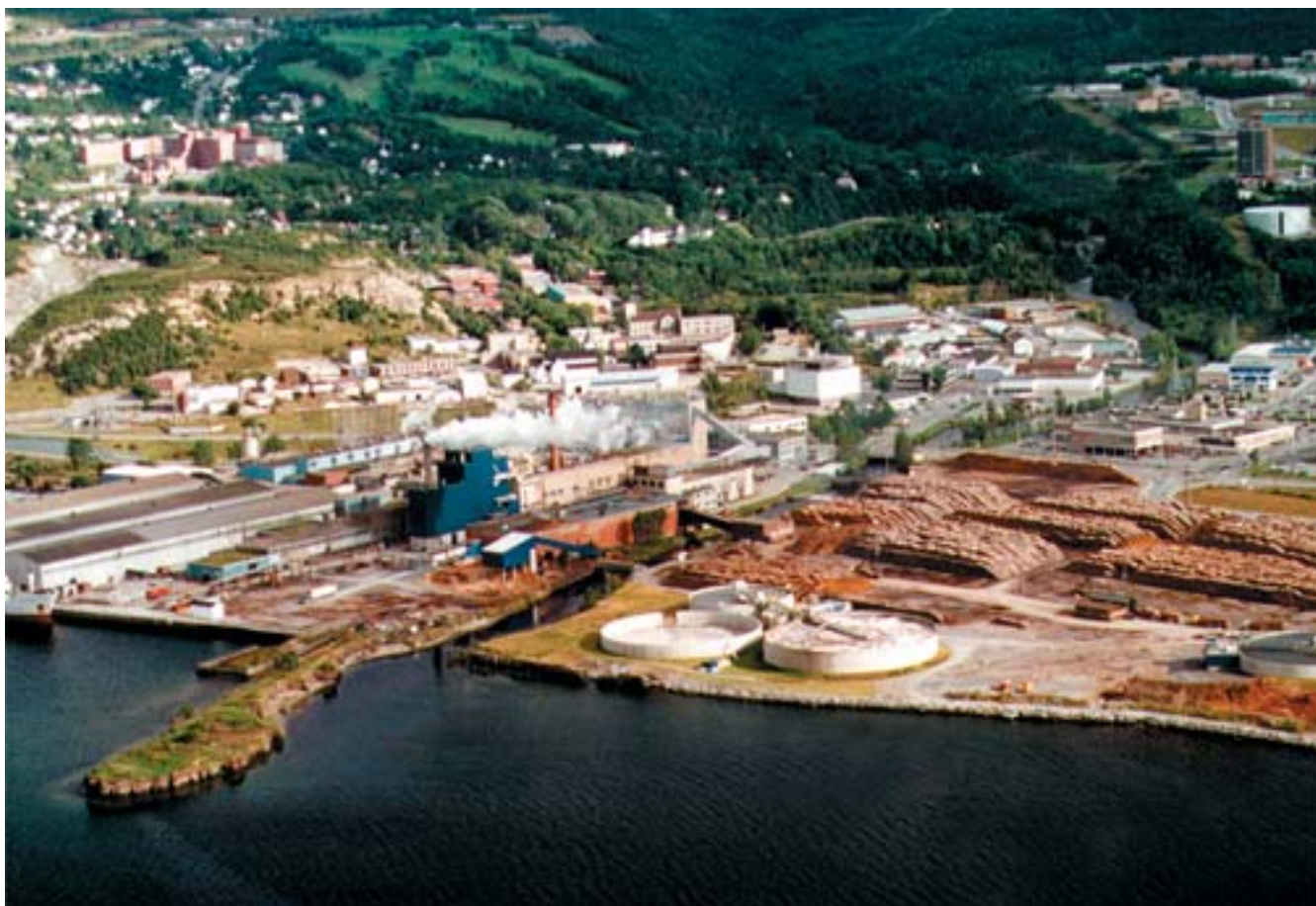

Corner Brook Pulp and Paper Limited is a pillar of the western Newfoundland economy. Founded in 1925 by the Newfoundland Power and Paper Company Limited, the Company has been part of the Kruger Organization since 1984. As early as 1985, Kruger began investing in a total modernization program at the mill. Rebuilt to meet modern standards, the four paper machines are now fed by new thermo-mechanical pulp (TMP) refiners.

Corner Brook Pulp and Paper produces high-quality standard newsprint made of TMP and recycled pulp in a wide range of basis weights and brightness. Its sheet is recognized for outstanding printability and is extensively used for four-color reproduction.



Corner Brook Pulp and Paper Limited serves an international customer base, delivering quality newsprint to major ports on the eastern seaboard of North America, and to key ports in Europe, Asia and Latin America. The North American market, mainly the United States, accounts for more than half of the mill's production. Europe is the second largest market. With its own all-weather, deep water harbor and stevedoring crews, the company has full control over shipment quality.



The competitive position of Corner Brook Pulp and Paper is reinforced through its ownership of hydroelectric generating facilities in Deer Lake and Watson's Brook, which supply approximately 70% of the mill's electricity. Following an aggressive energy conservation program, the company was cited by Natural Resources Canada for being among the most energy efficient mills in Canada, and received the distinction of Industrial Energy Innovator.



The secondary effluent treatment system in Corner Brook ensures the mill's compliance with environmental laws and regulations.
